Guest Speaker: Chino Valley Fire Chief, Dave Williams has 25 years of experience. Chino Valley Fire District is the only 1 of 55 districts to qualify in the State for Platinum District of Distinction. During Covid, the district set up the SOS program to pick up food and medications for Senior Citizens. The Board of Directors approved an emergency declaration allowing the set up mobile morgue services and an approved purchase of an ambulance which provides 24/7 backup service. CVFD is looking at working with a different agency that will allow them more flexibility. The Heart Safe program has as survival rate 3 times higher than the County rate and 2 times higher than the national rate. The ECNS Emergency Communication Nurse System has added a nurse triage system in 911 resource centers to help identify whether a true emergency vs. those that don't require hospitalization.

The new fire station 68 will contain 2 Battalion chiefs, 2 new mechanics, and 12 additional firefighter paramedics.
