Paula was born and raised in the Lincoln Heights area of Los Angeles. While living in Los Angeles, she served in numerous clubs, including:

- President of Sunset Hacienda Women's Club
- Member of the San Gabriel Valley Federation Board of Directors California Federation of Women's Clubs
- Member of La Puente Community Advisory Committee

She followed her husband and moved to Salt Lake City when he started Brog's Product Manufacturing, making Liquid Coffee Extract for flavoring. Paula ran Brog's Product Development after her husband's passing in 2014.

Paula's working career in California included Highlander Publications as an Editor and Reporter and then in Advertising Sales. In Utah, she joined the Enterprise, the Business Newspaper and became Vice President of Sales. Soon, she moved to The Newspaper Agency Corporation which became Media One, owner of the Dessert Morning News and the Salt Lake Tribune. She worked in sales and then became a Sales Manager.

Because of her involvement in the Hispanic community, Paula was asked to start a Spanish Language newspaper, called *Fronteras de la Noticia*. It was the first Spanish language Newspaper published by Media One.

In Salt Lake City, Paula was named Chairman of the Mayor's Business Advisory Board. She served as Chairman of The Utah Hispanic Chamber of Commerce and Chairman of the Mexicano Latino Institute of Utah, working with the Mexican Consul. She was invited to join a Trade Mission with Governor Herbert to Western Europe, where she learned how much Utah is liked and looked at as an opportunity for the world.

Other volunteer service groups include The Salvation Army Board with events to help the community, Board of Directors of Zion's Bank Women in Business, Centro de la Familia for Migrant Workers Children, The Latina Soroptimist, and as PIO of the Alumni Association of the Citizen's Academy of the FBI.

On Cinco de Mayo 2023, Paula was recognized by Centro Civico of Utah with a "Lifetime Achievement Award for Breaking the Glass Ceiling for Hispanic Women in Utah."

She now lives in Chino Hills, California, and joined the Chino Hills 55+ Club in September 2024. Paula was elected President of the 55+ Club in February 2025.
